Unity Hospice Open House at New Jack and Engrid Meng Residence

Green Bay, Wis. – June 25, 2007 – Unity, a not-for-profit leader in end-of-life care services, today announced plans to host an open house for the public on Monday, July 2, 2007, from 3:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m. at its new end-of-life care facility, the Jack and Engrid Meng Residence. The residence is named after the lead donors to Unity's campus campaign.

The residence is the first of its kind in Unity's northeastern Wisconsin service area. The residence features 12 private rooms, each with private bath and television/DVD, along with 3 family rooms, kitchen and patio available for resident and resident family use.

For over 30 years, Unity has been improving the end-of-life care options available to members of our communities. While most of Unity's patients prefer to remain at home with family and friends, more than half cannot because of the lack of an appropriately trained caregiver, or they need critical and compassionate health care services that cannot be delivered in the home. The residence will be staffed with experts in end-of-life care.

Unity's new residence is located on 34 acres in the town of Ledgeview. The campus also includes an administrative office building and memorial gardens are planned for the future. The residence is scheduled to open to residents on July 16, 2007.

Directions to Unity's campus: From Hwy 172, exit county road GV. Turn south toward Ledgeview. Travel approximately 2.5 mile on GV, turn left onto Oak Ridge Circle. Straight .25 mile and turn right at the entrance to Unity's campus.

Unity, a not-for-profit leader in hospice and palliative care, was established through the creation of a partnership of Green Bay's three not-for-profit hospitals – Bellin Health, St. Mary's Hospital Medical Center and St. Vincent Hospital.
