Unity Offers Family Grief Support through Innovative Program

Green Bay, Wis. – September 14, 2009 – Unity, leaders in hospice and palliative care, provides an innovative monthly program, *Generations—Hope for Grieving Families*, designed to support grieving families with children and teens ages 6 - 18.

Open to the public, *Generations—Hope for Grieving Families*, provides a chance for families to join in activities and discussions designed to encourage individual members to better understand the effects of grief and express their feelings in a safe environment. Facilitated by Unity's professional bereavement counselors and trained volunteers, monthly programs include complimentary dinner, followed by separate groups held concurrently for parents or guardians, teens and children. The program is held on the third Thursday of each month, from 5:30 to 7:30pm at Unity's De Pere office. The next program will be held on Thursday, September 17th and is open, free of charge, to individuals residing in Unity's 12-county service area: Brown, Calumet, Door, Forest, Kewaunee, Manitowoc, Marinette, Menominee, Oconto, Outagamie, Shawano and Waupaca counties.
